Thank you to YOU

Throughout the Covid-19 Crisis, we have continued to offer supportive services to all Carers whilst ensuring those with the greatest needs receive additional appropriate support.

Over time, our greater understanding of the crisis and the impact on Carers and their families has helped us shape and develop our services. We now have an enhanced offer for Carers as well as offering support during the recovery period.

Support we offer for Carers include:

- Telephone Carers assessments and support planning
- Help/advice to source practical help
- Connecting Carers with social care, legal and financial help
- Practical advice by our Duty Team
- Help to make an Emergency Plan
- Befriending and counselling support
- Peer support to help with wellbeing and resilience
- Specialist advice for conditions and links to other specialist services e.g. those with dementia or Parkinson's disease and mental health
- Social, practical and emotional support for Young Carers and their families

Derbyshire Carers Association support Carers who look after a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, mental health problems or an addiction cannot cope without their help or support. We are commissioned by Derbyshire County Council to be the lead provider of Carer Services across Derbyshire.

Community Response Unit

Derbyshire County Council and local partners are co-ordinating a massive community response across the county to make sure vulnerable residents are supported through the coronavirus outbreak.

Residents who could be helped by the Community Response Unit include those who are self-isolating because they, or a member of their household, is at risk from coronavirus. Support will be offered to residents struggling to meet their basic needs because of financial, social and health restrictions – including people who are shielding, those with some underlying health conditions and those aged 70 or over.

The Community Response Unit will help those in need by delivering services such as:

- food shopping and delivery
- checking up on people who are isolated with a phone call or online help to prevent loneliness and check whether there is anything they need
- collecting and delivering prescriptions

Telephone Befriending Service

Our Telephone Befriending service aims to provide a regular friendly phone-call (from a trained Volunteer) for companionship, a listening ear and support to isolated Carers living in Derbyshire (excluding Derby City) who are in need of social contact.

The service is designed to give support and friendly conversation to those Carers who are not able to get out and socialise, they may have lost contact with friends & family or might be unable to leave the person they care for.

Priority will be given to Carers who have little or no social contact and have little or no outlet to have a social chat with someone, due to their caring role and / or other health issues.

It is not for counselling purposes, or to give medical or financial advice.
