It was also enjoyed by the High Sheriff of Derbyshire and the Mayor of Derby. The professionalism of our staff who organise this event is second to none.

The Young Carers Service is going from strength to strength, we now have in place a Group Activity Worker, School Liaison Worker and Young Adult Carer Worker. These roles are enabling us to further identify Young Carers, engage with them and offer support. Our raising the awareness of the vital work that Young Carers do has been increased dramatically as a result of the hard work and commitment of these new staff members.

We have developed a Young Carers School Award that has been adopted across Amber Valley. Enthusiasm has been such that we hope it will be embraced throughout the County. In addition we have convened a multidisciplinary steering group, a big thank you to all those who are driving this work forward in their various agencies. We have high hopes for the steering group, resulting in systemic change throughout society.


The Young Adult Carer role enables DCA to work in a focused manner with 18-25 year olds. Many Young Carers in this age group have to make tough decisions resulting in their educational aspirations being limited. The aim of this innovative role is to provide support enabling Young Carers to broaden their options, to successfully access employment and further education opportunities.

In the County the new Carers Breaks and Training service is taking off in a huge way. I am happy to share with you the exciting news which has been reported on throughout the

partnerships with small and large organisation. These include self help peer groups and trips to the Duke of Devonshire Chatsworth Estate.

You will find news of our upcoming events and I would love for you to join us at the very popular Crooked Spire service on 14th December 2017 and looking to the New Year our EGM which is to take place on 26th January 2018 and includes Pamper Sessions. arts and crafts and the opportunity to get all your IT questions answered.

Since April we have been joined by 15 excellently qualified new staff. Some of these roles include our Community Engagement Team increasing our support for Carers from BME communities, those looking after someone with a intellectual disability, physical disability or addiction. Over the coming months we shall be recruiting additional staff to further meet the needs of over 90,000 Carers in the County of Derbyshire.

THE WORST OF TIMES

According to the 2011 census there were 25,516 Carers in the City of Derby. 6312 are providing more than 50 hours unpaid Care a week.

In recent years, the Carers journey in the City of Derby has not been what we would want for these heroes. The Carers journey has become fragmented as a result of the attempt to make a "market" of Carers Services. As a result some Carers have experienced delays in payments and an insufficient training and breaks offer that is difficult to measure.

Despite this Derbyshire Carers Association remains, by far, the main provider of Carers services in the City. We assist 9132 Carers each year with information and advice and prevent the decline of health and wellbeing of 3504 Carers each year. We find in excess of 1250 unsupported Carers each year. In addition we fulfil, on behalf of Derby City Council, 1241 Carers assessments yearly and then also support these Carers on an ongoing basis. This is a must do function set by Central Government and must not be put at risk.

One would have hoped that the above would be recognised and those parts of the Carers journey that are not working would be looked at again. Unfortunately, the preferred option in the current consultation perversely ends our contract on the 31st March 2018. Elsewhere in this Newsletter we have informed you as is our duty of this consultation and how you may make your views known.

Derbyshire Carers Association does not claim to be perfect, merely that any change, especially a radical one such as this, should be based on good data collection, analysis and decisions be evidence based.

We are aware of 93 Carers who have responded to the consultation expressing their view that the preferred option should be fundamentally reviewed. This is a crucial time for decision makers to lead the future of Carers Services in the City of Derby. We hope that this consultation will be truly meaningful and the views of seldom heard Carers and the expertise of Derbyshire Carers Association acquired over 29 years will result in a future that is an Age of Wisdom.

YOUNG CARERS SUMMER ACTIVITY

WILD THINGS

On an overcast day in the summer holidays 8 Young Carers attended an outdoor activity day with 'Wild Things' charity at Shining Cliff Woods, Belper.

This was a great opportunity for the Young Carers who attended experience the outdoor space and have a go at:

- Making an open fire to cook popcorn, toast, hot chocolate and sweetbread
- · Swinging on a rope swing
- Exploring caves
- Making keyrings out of wood found in the forest
- Den making
- Using flint and leaves to make a fire
- Wood whittling

The staff were incredibly helpful, encouraging everyone to try all the activities whatever their abilities and enabling the Young Carers to really enjoy 'hanging out' in a wood.

One of the groups climbed deep inside a cave, managing to weasel themselves through small holes to reach another part of the cave and explore. We then saw a protected wild bees nest!

Everyone was fully involved in the activities, supporting and encouraging each other. Some of the dens the young people made were amazing, with a couple of the Young Carers wanting to sleep in them overnight.

Feedback from the Young Carers was really encouraging, comments such as:

- 'It was great doing stuff with nature and learning to survive.'
- 'I loved making a key chain with material found in the wood.'
- 'I've never made a fire before and cooked food on it!'

Many Young Carers asked if they could do something similar again, with the possibility of a camping weekend in 2018













THORNTONS FACTORY TOUR

In the October half term, 18 Young Carers attended the Thornton's Factory in Alfreton for a fun filled day, learning about how chocolate is made.

SUPPORT FOR THOSE CARING FOR A LOVED ONE WITH A DRUG OR ALCOHOL ADDICTION



Addiction is defined as not having control, overdoing, taking or using drugs or alcohol to the point where it could be harmful. Many family members and friends of substance user's don't identify themselves as actually being a carer even though the care and support that they provide is so valuable.

Some substance users can also suffer from mental heath problems (Dual Diagnosis) the combined mental health and drug or alcohol dependency can be very difficult for the carer to understand therefore getting advice and information can help the carer to better manage their caring role which can then result in reducing their own personal stress and anxiety.

Caring in this role can be one of the most stressful aspects of caring. Carers of substance users often suffer profound feelings of shame and stigma this then enhances their feelings of isolation. Accessing support and getting information and advice can help to remove feelings of isolation.


Derbyshire Carers Association offer carer's assessments for those caring for a loved one with a drug or alcohol addiction: There is evidence that if the carer accesses support positive change can be achieved for the carer and the person they care for. Derbyshire Carers Association understands that carers caring for someone with a drug or alcohol addiction are often reluctant to attend generic support groups, this is often because of the shame and stigma that they feel.

NEW SERVICE FOR LEARNING DISABILITY CARERS

For many years I have been involved with people with learning difficulties and their carers. This has included working for both the City and County Council Social Work departments and prior to that in the Health Service as a nurse, nurse manager and tutor. For the past twenty years or so, however, I have been employed in the voluntary sector in work allied to advocacy and learning disability. From 2004 until recently I had the pleasure of developing and managing a person-centred advocacy service in the north of the county.

My role within DCA as Learning Disability Engagement Worker is in many ways a continuation of my long-term commitment to people with learning difficulty and their families. I am here to play a part in letting learning disability carers know what is on offer that can benefit both them and the people they care for, within Derbyshire Carers Association and in services generally. Another important aspect of my role is to support carers to get

involved in the meetings and forums that need their lived experience as carers to inform the policy, practice and direction of services.

One particular forum that needs learning disability carers input on a regular basis is the Derbyshire Learning Disability Partnership Board. This is organised into three "local" Boards: North Derbyshire, Amber Valley /South Dales, and Erewash/South Derbyshire. There is also a County Board that has over-all responsibility but it is the local boards that need increased representation by carers. In particular it is the South Dales area (Wirksworth, Ashbourne, Sudbury, Brailsford), South Derbyshire and the North Derbyshire area (High Peak, North East and Bolsover). These local forums meet quarterly in their localities and I see it as part of my job to give new volunteer representatives support to be part of these meetings.

It's great to be working with Derbyshire Carers
Association and with valued colleagues from other
agencies to assist carers and learning disabled people
to have as good as life as possible. So if anyone reads

FUTURE OF CARERS SERVICES IN DERBY CITY

Since the 9th October 2017 we have been informed that the current position of Derbyshire Carers Association providing information and advice, undertaking Carers Assessments, and providing ongoing support is potentially to cease on the 31st March 2018. See below a summary of the consultation:

Following the results of the Carers Survey in March 2017 work has been completed by Derby City Council to review the current process for Carers services within Derby. These services include information, advice and support, promoting carers wellbeing, emergency plans, training, Carers breaks and Carers assessments. The Future of Carers Services consultation is designed to inform how assessments and other Carers services could be delivered in the future.

There are currently two commissioned Carers contracts. Firstly with Derbyshire Carers Association (DCA) for support to discharge duties as defined in the Carers Act 2014 including assessment and signposting. Secondly with Creative Carers who provide carers short breaks, training, information and advice. These two separate contracts expire at the end of March 2018 and the end of August 2018 respectively, so the Council now need to consult on different approaches to the Carers Service in Derby City.

DERBY CITY CARERS ACTION GROUP

Following the announcement of the consultation a group of Derby City Carers have formed an Action Group (please see letter on the right) If you wish to join this Action Group please contact Derbyshire Carers Association on 01773 833 833 or email info@derbyshirecarers.co.uk.

The Council also want to consult on the viability and potential development of a jointly funded Carers website with DERBY CITY COUNCIL Derbyshire County Council to enable information and advice to be provided about relevant services and benefits, following the recommendations of Carers.

Derby City Council wants to hear your views on these proposals giving you the opportunity to shape future Carers services in Derby.
