DEAR FRIENDS

Dear Friends,

The Association has been busy in recent months recording and compiling the many activities and achievements of the last year. It has not been easy. This year is the first of a five year term of offering hope to the many thousands of carers in our beautiful County. Whilst looking through past promotional material for our many events, the colour purple jumped from the page. It combines calm stability of blue that every carer offers their loved one and fierce energy of red that is needed to make sure their family receives all the help they need and are entitled to.

I am pleased to say it is this same offer of stability and advocacy that has meant Derbyshire Carers has had a highly successful year on behalf of the approximated 130,000 adult carers and the estimated 6000 young carers in the County.

We are pleased to report our First Aid and Manual Handling training specially designed for individual carers is now firmly established. Initial feedback is excellent, learning objectives are agreed with each person and suited for the person they care for. If you feel you could benefit please book yourself onto one of the sessions. Please be aware also it's not all school work, because we are fortunate to have the White Peak on our doorstep the walking for carers initiative has got off to a "brisk" start. I shall be joining you on these and look forward to talking with you whilst we walk. This training is part of a wider initiative of Carers Breaks and Training, it is underpinned by the premise, for which there is considerable evidence that a modest level of help and training for a Carer early on in their carer journey will prepare them for a time that is much more challenging later that may threaten to overwhelm them.

This is the first year of our new Young Carers' service and currently we have a caseload of 192 young people we are working with. We have been provided with enough resource by the County Council to support 160 but the demand for the excellent support available from our workers has been such that we have used our own resources rather than close our doors to these children who do an amazing job looking after a vulnerable member of their family. We will continue raising awareness of

Young Carers and raise funds so we continue supporting families.

Thank you to the whole team overseen by Deborah Gouah. your work is greatly valued, and I am confident



the service will grow and continue introducing innovation to a vital area of our offer to young carers.

Another new major strand of our work is the Engagement service. We have been fortunate to have recruited well known and respected support workers in specific disease areas and their work is impacting positively amongst some of the most vulnerable carers and their families across the County. Jane Yeomans the Team Leader has joined us from the NHS and is working with Dot Inger and Peter Dawson overseeing their work offering support for those caring for a loved one with a drug or alcohol addiction and families affected by a loved one with learning disability. None of the work described above would be possible without the many Volunteers we have recruited and trained to support our work.

Many Volunteers have acquired a range of skills and knowledge that has resulted in them finding paid work. Although we are sorry to lose them we are delighted of course when this happens. Do contact us if you can offer time, skill, and insight into the caring role from which our carers can benefit.

We have been able to provide over 6000 telephone, advice and information sessions as well as nearly 500 home visits in our first year.

As I conclude this, I am hearing that Stephen Hawking passed away last night and am reminded of one of his most famous quotes. "....We are all Time travellers moving forward in time...." Although pleased with our first year we at DCA shall move forward with all of you to continually improve Carers Services in Derbyshire.

YOUNG CARERS SCHOOL AWARD

In association with Derbyshire County Council we are now launching our Young Carers School Award, which is available to all schools across Derbyshire. It details a set of standards, demonstrating good practice in supporting young carers in schools.



This will offer our schools recognition for the great work that they are doing for young carers. Schools will be given support to meet the standards and will be revisited regularly to help them to maintain and build on the work that they are doing.

SCHOOL LIAISON SERVICE

It's been a busy few months for school liaison. Since September I have been introducing the Young Carers Service to schools across the county. Focused work has begun in Amber Valley, with over 20 schools engaging with the service. Schools have had awareness raising assemblies for their pupils, telling all the children about young carers and how important they are to their families.

Staff in many schools have received training and support in how to identify and support young carers in their schools. This has led to an increase in the number of young carers being identified and referred to the young carers service, with many schools identifying several young carers.

The next targeted area is South Derbyshire, with focused work beginning here over the next few months. One of our High Peak workers is starting to raise awareness of young carers by visiting secondary schools in the High

Peak area.
Links have been made with the Education
Psychology team, and with the Locality
Children's Partnership teams, making sure that different services working with children across the county are aware of the service and how best to support young carers.

YOUNG CARERS IN THE NEWS

One of our young carers Alyssa was recently featured in the Derbyshire Times. Here is an excerpt from that article

"She's a little superstar, you don't have to ask her, she just does it," said mum Karena Waterfall.

Her 10-year-old daughter Alyssa helps look after two younger brothers who need a great deal of care and time. Harley, six, has severe autism and Teddy, three, is being tested for autism.

Harley can't talk and is prone to volatile behaviour, Teddy can only say a couple of words.

On trips around Ripley where the family live, Alyssa will take Teddy on a strap while Karena pushes Harley in a buggy. Karena said: "Without her, we wouldn't be able to get out. It would make every aspect we do twice as long and twice as hard.

"There have been days when I've had to go shopping and Harley's kicked off; I've had to physically restrain him and I'm sat in a heap on the floor with him.

Alyssa sees things that are not nice, things that she shouldn't have to see. "I've had days where I've sat and cried and she's had to give me a cuddle because there's been no-one else around."

SUPPORT FOR BME CARERS

We have been busy working with LINKS CVS to create an action plan for our partnerships with the Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) groups in Derbyshire.

We understand that many Carers in Derbyshire are from minority groups and may find it difficult to engage with services due to language and cultural barriers.



Following from the 'Report on the needs of BME Carers in Derbyshire' which LINKS produced in 2017 we have explored ways that we can reach more Carers from minority groups and ensure we are accessible for all Carers.

Dot Inger, DCA's Equality and Community Engagement Worker has been meeting with the different groups within the Community to learn more about how we as an organisation can help and support Carers known to them. We are also planning on introducing new Equality Carers Groups, having key DCA literature available in different languages and hosting an Equality Carers Network event.

Within our next edition of Carers News we will be detailing information of the forthcoming support groups for carers within the BME communities and of course all updates on future developments.

DCA ARE PROVIDING A VOICE FOR LEARNING DISABILITY CARERS

Over the past two months Gillian Butterfield (DCA volunteer) and I have been facilitating groups, on behalf of DCA, in a lengthy Engagement exercise alongside other carers, officers of Derbyshire County Council and colleagues with learning difficulties. We have both felt proud to represent Derbyshire Carers Association in the nine events which have taken place all over Derbyshire. The objective has been to discuss, in a structured and dynamic manner what makes "a good day" for someone with a learning disability. Learning Disability Carers and people with learning disability themselves were invited to come along to an Engagement event in their area. Over three hundred people (carers and people themselves with learning disability) took up the invitation and "engaged." In fact there has been more demand than capacity so more engagement events are being planned.

DCC have committed themselves to reviewing whether Day Activities for learning disabled people are "ticking the box" and really providing the variety of opportunities and fulfilment that people want. Carers have included parents, siblings, grandparents and at one event a caring friend who came along on a personal invitation. One family carer said to me that it was good to have DCA involved as it showed that we are an organisation that is interested and caring. Gillian and I took the opportunity to spread

the word that we are an organisation that flies a flag for people with learning disabilities and their carers and we gave out dozens of leaflets and newsletters in the process.

Though the days were principally about the day opportunities for people who have learning disability, carers were invited to put their own concerns down on a separate flip chart sheet. These comments will contribute to the final report which will be put together by the independent coordinator of the events (from Helen Sanderson Associates). It is interesting to note that the majority of these points expressed the carers' concerns for the well being and fulfilment of their "cared-for" friends and family members.

After a further series of events a report will be put to elected members and form a consultation document with specific consultation events resulting from that. As Gillian and I are intending to remain involved in this whole process we will make sure we give you updates on the progress of this engagement and consultation process. I think we all want the same thing ultimately; as good a life as possible for the people who are close to our hearts.


FREE MANUAL HANDLING TRAINING


