

That is why it is important to imagine it, plan, and do it. As somebody once said it's only a dream until you plan and take action. The team at DCA have been busy doing this. Please pull out and keep the calendar of activities and carer events we have scheduled for the year. Please book as early as possible, as many of you are aware many of our events are attended by hundreds of carers and places get taken up very quickly. Thank you to Michaela Bell and Nicky Parsons who lead on so many of our community events.



I have some congratulations to hand out. Helen Weston and the health liaison team were shortlisted by the Health Service Journal (HSJ) the leading news magazine for all matters NHS. To be one of 11 organisations selected from 1600 applications is true recognition, jolly well done to them. This indicates how hard and thoughtful DCA staff members work on behalf of carers in Derbyshire.

It is coming up to one year since the Care Act was introduced. From a standing start our carer support workers in Derby City and Derbyshire County have been working tirelessly to ensure that carers have received comprehensive reviews and received appropriate support to continue in their caring roles. The numbers of people needing and wanting support is formidable, but I am pleased to report we are making significant impact. Don't forget to share your personal stories, these help us to help others and build groups of mutual support and as well as provide a voice for carers at the various forums we attend.

The Care Act entitles a personal budget for carers providing necessary care. In the County, we successfully undertake all administration for personal budgets. Over twelve hundred payments have been issued, following careful consideration at panel meetings. In Derby City, all personal budget requests are submitted to the Council for consideration. Administration of budgets is carried out internally at the Council House.

Thank you to those of you who have come forward to help with our fundraising efforts. I am pleased to say there has been considerable success. Please be in touch if you can offer to drop off and bring back a collection box.

All of us at DCA are in awe of what carers do day in day out. Thank you and help us to help you.

HIGH SHERIFF

I am the current High Sheriff of Derbyshire, 2015-16. The office is held for twelve months and runs from April to April; so I am just approaching the end of my year.

Many people don't know what a High Sheriff is; there is one of them (and one only) in each county of England and Wales. So, 55 of us in total.

High Sheriffs are appointments made by the Monarch. Our official role is to look after the welfare of the judiciary in the County, which is a roundabout way of saying that we have oversight over law and order. My wife and I have spent time in Court with Judges, Magistrates and Coroners. We have been welcomed many times by the Police, and by Prisons both in Derbyshire and in Leicester. Additionally, we spend a great deal of time with charities, the emergency services, with the civic authorities, and with the military.

Amongst the charities I have visited, I was very pleased to meet Derbyshire Carers Association in January. Caring for an infirm or aged relative, or friend, or neighbour, or loved-one can be an onerous task. The plight of the carer is often overlooked and I was greatly impressed by what DCA achieves within our County. Sometimes, a carer doesn't choose to care for someone, it is just something that 'happens', and slowly but surely the job takes over

their life, especially affecting that person's ability to go out and earn money. It can be exhausting and lonely too.

When I went to the Ripley Headquarters I met Chief Executive Narinder Sharma and some of the team that work with him. Narinder explained to me that districts of North East Derbyshire and of Bolsover have amongst the highest density of carers in the United Kingdom. No wonder DCA play such a fundamental role in our County; and well done to them!

Being High Sheriff has been a great honour and privilege for me. I have been all over the County, from Glossop in the

North to Swadlincote in the South, and wherever I have gone I have met interesting and welcoming people. It is amazing how many people there are out there, working to make our County a 'better place'. Derbyshire is a truly great County and the Carers Association plays a great part in it.

'CARERS PLEDGE' SHORTLISTED FOR NATIONAL AWARD

Derbyshire Carers' Association's 'Carers Pledge' project was recently put forward for a Health Service Journal (HSJ) award by Southern Derbyshire CCG and they received an invitation to the award ceremony on the 18th November at the Grosvenor House Hotel, London to celebrate carers.

The Awards are a chance to come together as a community, celebrate achievements and how people have transformed patient care. Created in 1981, the awards are the largest celebration of excellence in UK healthcare, highlighting the most innovative and successful organisations, people and projects in the sector.

They give national recognition to the projects and initiatives that deliver healthcare excellence and innovation. By focusing on cutting-edge innovations and best practice, the awards give impetus to improving the quality of health care in the UK.

The HSJ received over 1,600 applications from 600 services and organisations and the Carers Pledge has been shortlisted to the last eleven in the category 'CCG Commissioning for Carers.'

That is why our community and health liaison workers work closely with local organisations, businesses, GP surgeries and hospitals to identify family carers as early as possible into their caring responsibilities.

The team regularly attend team meetings, student talks and, continually, raise awareness of the work and support family carers provide across the County and City of Derby.

As part of the national 'Carers Rights' awareness day on the 28th November 2015, Derbyshire Carers Association held a Carers Open day at the Derby Carers Hub and a Carers Express event at The Post Mill Centre, South Normanton.

Carers, their families and professionals were invited to attend to: raise awareness of family carers and to ensure they received relevant and up to date information.

People aged 18 or over who have been assessed as having moderate, severe or profound learning disabilities, or people with mild learning disability who have other complex health needs, are entitled to a free annual health check.

ASSISTED ACCESS SCHEME - DERBY THEATRE

The Assisted Access scheme is available to those that need someone to support them to be able access theatre performances.

To register for the scheme, there is a membership form that you can obtain from Derby Theatre. Together with the form, Derby Theatre require original documentation to show you receive one of the following:

- Disability Living Allowance
- Attendance Allowance
- Personal Independence Payment



Once you are a member, the person that assists you on your theatre trips receives a free ticket.

WORKING WITH GP PRACTICES

From the successful work we have through our Carers Pledge, it was recognised that the carers assessment service should be embedded within GP practices, allowing better joint working within the community and, a more accessible and flexible service for carer's.

DCA's very own Helen Weston has been working jointly with Dr Kaysia Heafield from Somercotes Medical Practice to introduce a pilot project, this was a success and as a result we are now working with 18 GP practices within Amber Valley and Southern Derbyshire Dales.

If you would like to take the opportunity to have a face to face carer assessment, please contact a GP surgery from the list below. You do not have to be registered at the GP practice to access this service.

We are continuing to work with GP practices and, are hopeful this will be available across Derbyshire and Derby City within the near future.




