CARERS AWARDS 2017

Derbyshire Carers Association staff and volunteers attended the prestigious Carers Awards Ceremony at Pride Park on the 27th July 2017.

Carroll Hammond - Carer Connect & Health Liaison Worker at Derbyshire Carers Association nominated two Derby City carers for the award, Victor Shaw-Willson and Janet Stocker.

Carroll described why she nominated Victor and Janet saying: "Victor is 96 years old and is definitely one to challenge conventional stereotypes about age. He looks after his wife Alicia, who has heart failure and dementia. In addition to caring Victor has also become a vital part of DCA, being responsible for collecting charity tins around Derby and various other things. Victor brings a lot to his caring role and the community!"

"Janet has cared for and supported her husband, Doug who has MS, for 30 years. She has become an expert at looking after Doug and also cares for him when he is in hospital. Janet has had to learn nursing skills, and is both Doug's communicator and facilitator. Without Janet, Doug's life expectancy would be considerably reduced.

Along the way Janet's own health has been compromised, but she still continues in her caring role with a positive outlook and a smile on her face!"

Victor was nominated for the Home Carer of the Year Award for his devotion in caring for Alicia. Janet was put forward for the Supporting Independence Award because of her ability to be compassionate towards others. Although not winners on the day Janet and Victor thoroughly enjoyed the awards ceremony and were worthy finalists!

We offer one to one support around issues related to their caring role, respite from caring, the opportunities to meet other young carers and support with transitions.

I have two roles; working as a Young Carers Support and Liaison Worker for the north of Derbyshire. Alongside colleagues I am the first port of call when accessing the service. I am also the Young Adult Carers Worker, working with young adult carers aged 16-25 with a particular focus on educational, training and employment needs and aspirations. I am really happy to join this new team but feel sorry to leave behind such wonderful colleagues and friends.

Paul Strachan is one of our much valued volunteers at Derby City Carers Hub.



As an ex-army man Paul enjoys being active despite health problems and doesn't let anything stop him. Although closer to 60 than 50 he still likes to get out and about walking with the 'love of his life and soulmate' his wife, Jean.

Despite suffering with epilepsy for the last 10 years and PTSD Paul has become a vital part of the Derby City volunteer team. He has personal experience of the challenges faced by carers having been a carer for his Dad for six years before he passed away.

In his time with DCA Paul has set up two specialist support groups, one for carers who have lost the person they care for, or the cared for has gone into residential care and the other is a 'guys only' male carers group. Not only does Paul work in the Derby Office doing support calls with carers but he also gets involved with various fundraising events and activities.

Paul describes the Derby staff as his 'life savers,' in particular, Carer Connect Worker Emma Handley who supported him during an especially difficult time when he was caring for his dad. In turn we would like to thank Paul and all of our dedicated volunteers, in the city and county, who assist us in supporting carers.



DCA SUPPORT GROUPS

ALVASTON CARERS SUPPORT GROUP

Alvaston Carers Support group was formed in (approximately) 2013 by Gill Withers, a carer for her husband, and a DCA carers Ambassador. Kathy Smedley, a fellow ambassador, came on board, and took over the running of the group in 2015 when Gill left the area.

The group meets monthly to provide emotional support and an information service for local carers. Funds are raised by making craft items to sell at local events, the money raised financing refreshments at the meetings, subsidies for occasional theatre trips, and a free Christmas lunch at a local pub/restaurant.

They try to provide a relaxed, informal atmosphere, meeting at Alvaston library on the second Tuesday of the month (except August and December), where carers can have a cup of coffee and a chat, easing the pressures of their role for a little while.

Wherever possible, people from other organisations, such as Creative Carers, Healthwatch, Carelink and Community Action come along to give a talk on matters relating to the caring role, such as nutrition, safety in the home and the need for relaxation and exercise. Kathy attends various council-led meetings and keeps members of the group up to date with carer support developments and events in the city by sending out a newsletter every month or two. Some carers are not connected to the internet so this is an effective way of ensuring that they receive vital information that they might otherwise miss.



Being a carer can be very isolating, and the carers group is only one of many initiatives in Alvaston, playing a vital role in the formation of community support throughout the area.

The Alvaston Carers group based at Alvaston Library, 1252-1254 London Road, Alvaston, Derby, DE24 8QP meets every 2nd Tuesday of the month at 10.00am.
